**SUBJECT:** FFY 2022-2023 Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) Review Committee Recommendation

#### **BACKGROUND**

NWARPC will receive suballocated Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) funds through the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA, aka BIL) for five (5) years beginning in FFY 2022. NWARPC is estimated to receive \$2,171,581 CRP funding for FFY 2022 and FFY 2023, after \$50,000 is utilized for the development of a Carbon Reduction Strategy as approved in the FY 2023 UPWP.

- The RPC/Policy Committee approved the CRP focus areas on May 25, 2022
- The RPC/Policy Committee approved the application and scoring matrix on August 24, 2022
- NWARPC issued a call for projects on August 28, 2022
- Applications were due on October 17, 2022

NWARPC received eight (8) project applications with a total request of \$2,513,848. Applicants presented their projects to the TAC Committee on October 20, 2022. There were four (4) projects that also submitted ARDOT TAP applications. These projects were the Cave Springs, Centerton, Fayetteville (2), and Siloam Springs projects.

During the Review Committee meeting on November 4, 2022, the ARDOT 2022 TAP project award list was posted on the ARDOT website. Cave Springs received \$348,000 (of \$358,784 requested) and Siloam Springs received \$184,000 (of \$184,000 requested) in ARDOT TAP awards. This reduced the requested NWARPC CRP funds to \$1,981,848, which is less than the estimated available funds. The Review Committee chose not to tour or score the projects as there appeared to be enough funding for all of the project proposals after the ARDOT TAP awards announcement was posted. The Fayetteville (1) LED lighting project was chosen to be reduced or increased in funding based on Congressional action to fund the FFY 2023 CRP.

The assumptions for the FFY 2023 funding estimate are based on draft ARDOT STIP 2023 estimate with an assumed 100% obligation limitation (OL).
