(1) CALL TO ORDER

The hybrid, in-person and virtual NWARPC/Policy Committee Meeting was called to order by Chair, Mayor Chris Keeney at 1:33 p.m.

(2) ROLL CALL OF MEMBERS

In-person attendees introduced themselves and Tim Conklin named the virtual attendees. Nicole Gibbs recorded member names and tallied votes. A quorum was reached.

(3) APPROVE RPC/POLICY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES FOR MAY 25, 2022

Chair Mayor Keeney asked the Committee whether there were any additions or corrections to the meeting minutes and requested a motion to approve the May 25, 2022 RPC/Policy Committee Meeting Minutes.

<u>MOTION</u>: Mayor Jeff Van Sickler made a motion to approve the May 25, 2022 RPC/Policy Committee Meeting Minutes as presented. Sunny Farmahan provided the second. Motion passed unanimously.

(4) DIRECTOR'S REPORT/CLEARINGHOUSE REVIEW

Jeff Hawkins gave the director's report saying the Clearinghouse Report was sent out and explained that there were 25 federal aid applications filed totaling about \$6.5 million. He said the federal planning certification review conducted by FHWA and FTA officials was completed in early June and went quite well. He said we have learned that the US Census will be releasing their delineation of Urban Areas in December based on the 2020 Census. He explained that they made substantial changes in the determination of what is considered "urban", and gave the example that they are using housing unit density as opposed to population density. He said funding programs could be impacted and some jurisdictions who were in the Urbanized Area, may not be in the 2020 Urban Area. He also explained that the Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA), issued by the Office of Management & Budget, is based on the Census Bureau's delineation of urban areas as well as workforce commuting patterns and are not scheduled for release until June 2023. Lastly, he shared that Population Certifications should be possible soon and briefly described benefits and the process. He said they are very simple to do and we are available to help anyone with that.

Chair Mayor Keeney asked whether there were any questions, and there were none.

(5) UPWP FY 2023 AMENDMENT #1 – Regional Comprehensive Safety Action Plan - Vision Zero Plan Chair Mayor Keeney introduced the item and Tim Conklin explained that in May, the RPC/Policy Committee passed a resolution moving forward with a Regional Comprehensive Safety Action Plan. He said since that meeting, ARDOT requested that we also amend our FY 2023 UPWP to reflect the \$400,000 that we will be using in federal funds to develop a consultant-led plan. He said we also have applied for and received a local matching grant through the Walton Family Foundation (WFF). He said we completed public notification and did not receive any public comment regarding the amendment, and both ARDOT and MoDOT have reviewed the amendment and did not have any

comments. He said we have prepared a resolution for your consideration approving the amendment and the matching grant. He thanked the WFF for their continued support of our regional initiatives.

A. <u>RESOLUTION #2022-10</u> – Amending the NARTS FY 2023 UPWP to Prepare a Regional Comprehensive Safety Action Plan and Accept a Matching Grant

Chair Mayor Keeney asked whether there were any questions or comments, and hearing none, requested a motion to approve Resolution #2022-10 Amending the NARTS FY 2023 UPWP to Prepare a Regional Comprehensive Safety Action Plan and Accept a Matching Grant.

MOTION: Jim Ulmer made a motion to approve Resolution #2022-10 Amending the NARTS FY 2023 UPWP to Prepare a Regional Comprehensive Safety Action Plan and Accept a Matching Grant. Mayor Stephanie Orman provided the second. Motion passed unanimously.

(6) NARTS FFY 2021-2024 TIP AMENDMENT #4 - MoDOT

Chair Mayor Keeney introduced the item and Tim Conklin explained that the Missouri Highway and Transportation Committee (MHTC) approved their FY 2023-2027 MoDOT STIP on July 2, 2022. He summarized the proposed changes to the NARTS 2021-2024 TIP. He said a resolution has been prepared to accept these proposed changes based on the adopted STIP.

A. RESOLUTION #2022-11 - Amending the NARTS FFY 2021-2024 TIP

Chair Mayor Keeney asked if there were any questions and hearing none called for a motion to approve Resolution #2022-11 Amending the NARTS FFY 2021-2024 TIP.

<u>MOTION</u>: Mayor Stephanie Orman made a motion to approve Resolution #2022-11 Amending the NARTS FFY 2021-2024 TIP. Mayor Jeff Van Sickler provided the second. Motion passed unanimously.

(7) FFY 2023 STBGP-A & TAP PROPOSED PROJECTS/SCHEDULE (Informational Item)

Chair Mayor Keeney introduced the item and Tim Conklin explained that in the Spring we issued a call for projects and those were presented to our Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) last week. He said we have scheduled a site visit on August 4, 2022 to tour the proposed projects. He said we will have recommendations coming from TAC on August 18, 2022 and RPC/Policy Committee for vote on August 24, 2022. He summarized the estimated funding for FY 2023 as follows:

He said as everyone is aware, inflation has hit everyone's projects very hard, so many existing projects are asking for additional funds due to the rising costs of construction to bring their funding amounts up to 80-percent of the total project cost. He said we have set up a review committee and he opened it up to others who may want to participate. He asked whether there were any questions on the process and what to expect over the next four weeks. There was a question to repeat funding totals, and no other questions were raised.

(8) 2045 METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLAN AMENDMENT DISCUSSION – Carbon Reduction (CR) Program Funding and National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Program Funding Chair Chris Keeney introduced the item and Tim Conklin explained briefly that we are going to look at the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) and identify what changes we need to make to our 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), including adding the Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) and National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Program funding.

(9) FFY 2023-2026 STIP/TIP DEVELOPMENT (Informational Item)

Chair Mayor Keeney introduced the item and Tim Conklin explained that ARDOT released their DRAFT FY 2023-2026 STIP and said ARDOT will be discussing the STIP over the next couple months and we will take these projects and develop our FY 2023-2026 TIP. He summarized the notable projects in the region including the western portions of Hwy 612 (future US 412), Hwy 112 projects, and XNA Access Road going to construction during this STIP period, and the eastern portions of US 612 shown in Project Development during this STIP period. He said we have talked about some of these projects for many, many years and it is exciting seeing these on the draft STIP.

(10) PROJECTS AND OTHER UPDATES

A. FFY 2022 STBGP-A & TAP Obligation Plan

Chair Mayor Keeney introduced the item and Tim Conklin said we have to obligate \$8.6 million of last year's money and we will be working closely with the cities in the coming weeks to determine whether they are ready to obligate. He said ARDOT requested an obligation plan and he sent them the following:

Conklin explained that he is showing most projects being obligated that are not partnership projects with ARDOT, with the exception of project 090601 in Lowell and 040854 in Tontitown. He said there are a lot of moving parts with this, and if there are projects that we thought would obligate, cannot, we may have to do a lot of shuffling at the August RPC/Policy Committee meeting to make this work. He said we need to get our carry over amount down below \$1 million.

C. National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Update

Tim Conklin said the nomination of US 412 as an AFC Corridor-Pending was approved by USDOT. He said the \$54.1 million that Arkansas gets is limited to interstates and AFC's, which includes I-49 and now US 412 in NWA. He thanked ODOT, ARDOT, and the Governor's Officer for their support of the nomination.

D. Transportation Systems Maintenance and Operations (TSMO)/Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS)

Elizabeth Bowen summarized and presented updates on the Transportation Systems Maintenance and Operations (TSMO)/Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS). She said staff and the committee continue to meet with Cambridge Systematics on the projects. She said there is a planned workshop in September, which will be open to regional participation and contribution.

E. NWA Regional Assessment of Stormwater Management

Elizabeth Bowen said we continue to work with Halff, Corps of Engineers and ANRD on the funding and scope of the project. She said we will continue to wait on the ARPA funds application to become available.

F. Carbon Reduction Program and Application Update

Elizabeth Bowen explained that we anticipate \$1.1 million for FFY 2022 and \$1.1 million for FY 2023. She said we reserved \$50,000 in the UPWP for developing the Carbon Reduction Plan and the purpose of the plan is to reduce transportation emissions.

Bowen said the RPC/Policy Committee has approved focus areas for our CRP. She said we have drafted an application and scoring matrix for TAC review, with an anticipated call for projects late summer or early fall. She said we hope to have their recommendation for you at the August meetings.

G. Regional Comprehensive Safety Action Plan Update

Bowen said the RPC/Policy Committee previously agreed to move forward with a Regional Comprehensive Safety Action Plan. She described the USDOT Safe Streets and Roads for All Program (SS4A) and that NWARPC will apply by September 15, 2022 for an Action Plan Grant with the goal of having a plan in place so that cities can apply for funding in 2023. She said this project is moving forward quickly. She summarized the procurement process as follows:

Procurement Process:

- LOI Noticed (Approved by ARDOT) May 19
- Selection Committee ranked and selected 3 most highly qualified candidates June 14
- RFP/Scope developed (<u>Approved by ARDOT in 1 day</u>) June 20
- RFP/Scope sent to candidates June 30
- Q&A answered July 12
- RFP's due 4:00 TODAY July 21
- Interviews are set for July 27
- Selection Committee Scoring Meeting July 27
- Reference checks July/Aug
- Draft contract/contract negotiations Aug (ARDOT Approval)
- Kick-off meeting, public outreach, develop Plan (Sep-July)
- Apply for Projects (Jul-Sep 2023)

Bowen and Conklin thanked ARDOT for their quick reviews throughout this procurement process.

(11) COMMITTEE AND GROUP UPDATES

A. Active Transportation Committee (ACT)

Elizabeth Bowen said the committee and subcommittee both met on May 19, 2022 and the subcommittee met on June 16, 2022. She said the subcommittee met on updating the NWA Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan, including updates to community plans. She said they have developed online, in-person, and intercept surveys as part of the Public Outreach work. She said the public survey was extended to July 31, 2022, which doubled the number of respondents.

B. NWA Open Space Coalition

Elizabeth Bowen stated the group met July 26, 2022. They discussed a membership and dues program that they would like to implement. They talked about BIL opportunities, and a letter of support for Lake Francis conservation efforts. She also presented the following updates:

- NWALT 300 acres purchased as Blackburn Bluffs Preserve
- NWALT 25 acres bird sanctuary in Tontitown,
- Ozark Land Trust Baldwin area conservation for stream/lakeside birds
- City resolution update
 - In pipeline: Rogers, Siloam, Pea Ridge, Greenland, Centerton, Springdale New for Pipeline: Lincoln, Cane Hill
- Next meeting scheduled: September 27, 2022 @ 10:00 am.

Jeff Hawkins and Tim Conklin reminded the group that the August 24, 2022 meeting will be where the RPC/Policy Committee will award millions of dollars in project funding and asked everyone to please attend.

John McCurdy requested that the group consider implementing a regional vision for Hwy 265 similar to what has been implemented for Hwy 112 in order to preserve the high functionality of the eastern corridor, particularly as we see more and more connections onto it. He said he fears if we do not have something in place, we will continue to see pressure to signalize increasing numbers of intersections and it will become another 71B. He said it is a great road right now, but it will not be great for long if we do not manage it. Conklin said we will place a discussion item on next month's

TAC agenda. Hawkins said it is a good item for discussion, but we need to have the Cities at the table. He said we had this discussion way back when and we had cooperation from some and others were not interested in access management.
