(1) CALL TO ORDER

The in-person and virtual NWARPC Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) Meeting was called to order by Chair Patsy Christie at 10:30 a.m.

(2) ROLL CALL OF MEMBERS

In-person attendees named themselves with Tim Conklin naming the virtual attendees. Nicole Gibbs recorded member names and tallied votes. A quorum was reached.

(3) APPROVAL OF THE APRIL 20, 2023 TAC MEETING MINUTES

Chair Christie asked the Committee whether there were any additions or corrections to the meeting minutes and hearing none, requested a motion to approve the April 20, 2023 TAC Meeting Minutes.

MOTION: Paul Libertini made a motion to approve the April 20, 2023 TAC Meeting Minutes. Lance Jobe provided the second. Motion passed unanimously.

(4) ILLINOIS RIVER FLOOD STUDY – U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS PRESENTATION

Patsy Christie introduced the item and Tim Conklin introduced Rheannon Hart with the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and thanked her for agreeing to present the flood study to the Committee today. Hart, a hydrologist in the Little Rock District, gave an overview of the "Effects of Climate and Land-Use on Flooding in the Illinois River Basin of Oklahoma and Arkansas" study. More information can be found on the USACE website:

Following the presentation, there was discussion regarding the riparian buffers recommended in the study, being 100 feet on either side and were simulated for the main stems of the watershed and some tributaries. Hart said if all tributaries incorporated buffers, it would have an even larger effect. There was discussion regarding coordinating the findings with NOAA and FEMA to update the Atlas precipitation frequency estimates. Hart said it was not part of this study.

Conklin thanked Hart again and highlighted some of the ongoing efforts in the region, including streamside protection ordinances that some cities have in place, the Cave Springs Karst Resource Conservation Study conducted by the Commission that included drainage criteria manual updates for the four large cities, and the NWA Open Space plan, which outlines approaches to protect our natural resources and natural infrastructure.

(5) FY 2024 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP) DRAFT REVIEW – Recommendation to RPC/Policy Committee

Chair Christie introduced the item and Tim Conklin explained that each year we put together the annual Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) showing how we plan to use the federal funds that

come to our region for the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO). He said our fiscal year begins July 1 and goes through June 30. He said we held a public comment period from May 3, 2023 through May 17, 2023 and no comments were received. He summarized the content of the UPWP and said we coordinate with MoDOT, ARDOT, and USDOT for review.

Chair Christie asked the Committee whether there were any questions and hearing none, requested a motion to recommend to the RPC/Policy Committee the Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP).

<u>MOTION:</u> Ryan Carr made a motion to recommend to the RPC/Policy Committee the Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). Paul Libertini provided the second. Motion passed unanimously.

(6) SAFE STREETS AND ROADS FOR ALL (SS4A) REGIONAL COMPREHENSIVE SAFETY ACTION "VISION ZERO" PLAN (CSAP) – Recommendation to send to 2-week Public Comment Period

Patsy Cristy introduced the item and Tim Conklin said today we are asking to authorize a two-week public comment period to be held from June 5 – June 19, 2023 and we will bring the draft plan to TAC on June 15, 2023 and RPC/Policy Committee on June 28, 2023. He summarized the following:

IMPLEMENTATION GRANTS DUE JULY 10TH

There was discussion regarding the incomplete draft document distributed to TAC prior to this meeting and Conklin said the complete final draft for public comment will be posted on June 2, 2023, but in the meantime, we thought it was important to share the overall structure and layout of the plan. He reminded TAC of the expedited timeline to have the draft plan ready for adoption on June 28, 2023 by the Policy Committee for those communities planning to submit SS4A Implementation Grants by the July 10, 2023 deadline.

Chair Christie asked the Committee whether there were any questions and hearing none, requested a motion to approve entering a 2-week public comment period for the Draft Regional "Vision Zero" Comprehensive Safety Action Plan (CSAP).

<u>MOTION:</u> Ryan Carr made a motion to approve entering a 2-week public comment period for the Draft Regional "Vision Zero" Comprehensive Safety Action Plan (CSAP). Paul Libertini provided the second. Motion passed unanimously.

(7) PROJECTS AND OTHER UPDATES

A. FY 2023 STBGP-A/TAP/CRP - Project Development

Chair Christie introduced the item and Tim Conklin said we have seen most of the Agreements of Understandings (AoUs) for Surface Transportation Block Grant Program – Attributable (STBGP-A) and Transportation Alternatives Project (TAP) released for signatures, however the Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) projects are another story. Conklin said going forward, Elizabeth Bowen will be doing the competitive selection process and Nicole Gibbs will be doing the project tracking. He said we are also looking into software to assist with this process. He said you can still contact him, but to please copy Bowen and Gibbs regarding your projects. He said we have awarded over \$120 million to communities throughout Northwest Arkansas since 2013.

B. FY 2024 STBGP-A/TAP/CRP – Application Cycle Update

Conklin said you will need a resolution if you are submitting applications for the July 14, 2023, 4:00pm deadline for the current call for projects. He said because it has been taking six to eight months to receive Agreements of Understandings (AoUs) for the FY 2023 projects, obligating funds by August is going to be a big challenge. He asked those cities who have existing multimillion-dollar projects that will be requesting additional funds in this cycle to please let us know soon or send in your applications soon, as we are required to send an obligation plan to ARDOT by June 30 and we will need to start the juggling process between fiscal years to meet ARDOT's \$1 million carry over requirement.

Conklin said now is the time to request funding and to let us know if you have any questions regarding eligibility.

Conklin said the Arkansas Department of Energy & Environment (ADEE) is submitting a Charging and Fueling Infrastructure (CFI) grant and has distributed a survey. He said if you are interested in charging infrastructure in your community, you should get in touch with them. He said he is happy to share the survey and contact information. He said Ozark Regional Transit (ORT) is submitting a CFI grant for 17 areas in our region, which may also be an opportunity to get electric vehicle infrastructure in your community.

Conklin said he has had several members ask recently about the Local Bridge Program (LBP), which is for off-system bridges, is a 90/10 match program, and the bridge needs to be in poor or fair condition. He said it is a good opportunity to apply for bridges on the National Bridge Inventory that are off-system, or are located on FHWA Functionally Classified roads that are designated below a "major collector" classification.

Conklin said we shared last month that states throughout the county will receive funding through the EPA Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG) program, to develop and implement plans for reducing greenhouse gas emissions and other harmful air pollution. He said the EPA suggested that other entities interested in the funding submit a notice of intent to participate (NOIP), which NWARPC did, along with Metroplan and Ft. Smith. He said we have a meeting with ADEE on May 23 to talk more about what the program might look like for NWARPC.

Conklin shared and summarized other resources, including the USDOT Key NOFO website (www.transportation.gov/bipartisan-infrastructure-law/key-notices-funding-opportunity), SS4A Office Hours, and the DOT Navigator. He said there are more webinars and information than one could possibly attend, but we do try to keep an eye on it and inform our members.
