(1) CALL TO ORDER

The hybrid, in-person and virtual NWARPC/Policy Committee meeting was called to order by Chair Mayor Doug Sprouse at 1:30 p.m. and Sprouse welcomed members attending in person and virtually.

(2) ROLL CALL OF MEMBERS

In-person attendees introduced themselves and Tim Conklin named the virtual attendees. Luke Aitken recorded member names and tallied votes. A quorum was reached.

(3) APPROVAL OF MARCH 26, 2025, RPC/POLICY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

Chair Mayor Doug Sprouse stated that the March 26, 2025, Policy Committee meeting minutes were deferred for approval until the next meeting.

(4) DIRECTOR REPORT & CLEARINGHOUSE REPORT

Chair Mayor Doug Sprouse introduced the item and Director Tim Conklin said the commission has completed their FFY 2024 Financial Audit and that staff will soon upload the audit to the federal audits clearinghouse once approved and send a copy to all commission members for their records.

A. Accepting the 2024 NWARPC Audit

Chair Mayor Doug Sprouse asked whether there were any questions and hearing none, requested a motion to accept the 2024 NWARPC Audit.

MOTION: Jim Ulmer moved to accept the 2024 NWARPC Audit; Barry Moehring seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Conklin continued his Director's report, highlighting the Arkansas State Legislative Session and various Bills that have been signed into law affect cities' and counties' authorities related to land use planning and zoning regulation. He showed and summarized the information below:

2025 Arkansas Legislative Session (*informally ended April 16, 2025*)

Bills Signed into Law (Planning Legislation):

[ACT 313 "Accessory Dwelling Units"](#) (HB1503)

An act to amend the law concerning municipal regulations; to prohibit certain restrictions on the regulation of accessory dwelling units; and for other purposes.

[ACT 314 "Territorial Jurisdiction"](#) (HB1510)

An act to amend the law concerning territorial jurisdiction of municipalities; to repeal the authority for a municipality to exercise territorial jurisdiction over an unincorporated area of a county; and for other purposes.

[ACT 591 "Third-Party Contractors"](#) (SB322)

An act to amend the law concerning construction and development; to allow third parties to perform plan reviews and site inspections; and for other purposes.

[ACT 595 "Administrative Rezonings"](#) (SB505)

An act to amend the law concerning municipal planning; to require an administrative procedure for changes to the zoning or district designation of property in certain instances; and for other purposes.

[ACT XXX "County Property in City Limits"](#) (SB571) **ORDERED ENROLLED 4/16/2025**

An act to amend the law concerning municipal building and zoning regulations; to prohibit a municipality from enforcing buildings and zoning regulations on county property; and for other purposes.

Notes:

- Bills from this session will take effect 90 days after Sine Die – meaning early August.
- In mid-late May APA AR and ARML plan to set up a Spring Meeting (possibly a one-day seminar) to discuss the impact of legislation from the session.

Conklin said the Commission has been invited to apply for a Walton Family Foundation grant to bring a delegation from the region to the 33rd Congress for New Urbanism, which will take place in Providence, RI on June 11-14, 2025. Conklin stated that the 34th Congress for New Urbanism will be held right here in Northwest Arkansas in the summer of 2026, and encouraged members to attend this year's congress in Rhode Island, setting the stage as conference hosts for the 2026 event coming to NWA.

Conklin outlined upcoming events in the region including the NWA Vulnerable Road Users Safety Summit on June 3, 2025 and the ULI NWA Spring Symposium on Infrastructure on April 25, 2025. Lastly, he said NWARPC has agreed to help Arkansas Department of Energy & Environment to circulate basic messaging for public outreach purposes on the regional Air-Quality Watch "Code Orange" ozone advisories. Conklin asked if there were any questions from the group and there were none.

(5) FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2026 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP) APPROVAL

Chair Mayor Doug Sprouse introduced the item and Nicole Gibbs summarized the draft UPWP (covering July 1, 2025–June 30, 2026) including work-element budgets, financial tables, and the long-range work-product timeline. She said a public comment period was held March 31 through April 14, 2025, and the Technical Advisory Committee recommended approval on April 18, 2025. Tim Conklin outlined the work tasks covered in the work plan and summarized the multiple source financial summary.

A. **RESOLUTION #2025-07 – Approving the Northwest Arkansas Regional Transportation Study (NARTS) Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)**

Chair Sprouse asked for any outstanding questions from the group, and hearing none, requested a motion to approve Resolution #2025-07 Approving the Northwest Arkansas Regional Transportation Study (NARTS) Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP).

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MOTION: Barry Moehring made a motion to approve Resolution #2025-07 Approving the Northwest Arkansas Regional Transportation Study (NARTS) Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). Seconded by Ernie Penn. Motion carried unanimously.

(6) ARKANSAS TRI-REGION COALITION CPRG IMPLEMENTATION GRANT – Metroplan Progress

Summary

Chair Mayor Doug Sprouse introduced the item and Tim Conklin gave an overview of the EPA CPRG Implementation Grant and the NWA Green Network projects and programs before introducing Bernadette Rhodes, Metroplan Deputy Director and Senior Regional Planner for Partnerships and Grants. Rhodes thanked the Board for having her and gave an update on progress made to date on the Tri-Region Coalition EPA CPRG Implementation Grant. She reported that 14 sub-award agreements are now signed and executed. Early restoration work is now underway at River Commons, University of Arkansas Oak Ridge, and Rogers Osage/Blossom Way Creeks. She stated that only \$32,000 in draw-downs have been processed to date; adding that quarterly site visits to monitor progress will continue through 2025. Rhodes asked for any questions on the material presented and none were heard.

(7) PROJECT AND OTHER UPDATES

A. NWARPC Funding Programs (STBGP-A/TAP/CRP) – FFY2025 Obligation Plan & FFY2026 Funding Cycle

Chair Mayor Doug Sprouse introduced the item and Tim Conklin that project sponsors should be working toward obligation of their federal aid projects and the timely submission of quarterly reports to ARDOT and NWARPC. He said staff met with ARDOT on April 18, 2025 to go over project status and discuss a FFY 2025 obligation plan scenario. He reminded project sponsors of roles and responsibilities between the LPA's, NWARPC, and ARDOT.

Nicole Gibbs gave an overview of the FFY 2026 NWARPC Funding Programs Timeline, showing the following:

Gibbs said project sponsors gave brief presentations to the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) on April 17, 2025 and the selection committee is scheduled to tour and score the project proposals on May 7, 2025. She said we anticipate having a recommended list of projects for Board consideration at the next meeting on May 28, 2025.

B. Forward2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), Transit Alternatives Study (TAS) and Travel Demand Model (TDM) Updates

Tim Reavis provided an overview of recent staff efforts to kick off the *Forward2050 Plan* (2050 MTP) and its components. He stated that the MTP is federally required to be updated every five years. Reavis said NWARPC is under contract with consultant WSP to assist staff in developing two key components of the MTP: an update to the Travel Demand Model (TDM) and a new Transit Alternatives

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Study (TAS) to better prepare the region for its projected population growth through 2050.

Reavis said that a public survey to help inform the plan was launched on March 1, 2025 and has received 811 responses so far. He said two Public Open House Events were held at the Fayetteville Public Library on April 9, 2025 and at the Bentonville Public Library on April 10, 2025 to gather public input to support the plan's development. He said they were very well attended and thanked those who came out in support of the effort. He said the regional transportation plans' core goals remain focused on integration of local plans and guidance to improve the quality of life in NWA as the region's population rapidly grows.

- **Razorback Greenway Corridor Plan**

Tim Reavis recapped recent progress made with consultant team from Field Operations on the Razorback Greenway Corridor Master Plan. He said elected officials and staff leaders from all seven cities will accompany Field Operations and NWARPC staff on a trip to the Atlanta Beltline tomorrow. He said the group will be touring the Beltline and meeting with Atlanta Beltline, Inc. staff, and others to hear about successes and lessons learned. Reavis said one-on-one meetings with the consultant team and city leadership are scheduled for the following week, May 1 and 2, 2025. He said the consultants and staff will also be tabling during the Square2Square event on Saturday, May 3, 2025 as one of two primary outreach events for the project and to promote the ongoing project survey.
